PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE NEMA BY-LAWS

At their July meeting the NEMA Board voted to recommend to the membership a proposed change to the By-Laws. Article I Membership/Dues currently reads:

Membership shall be limited to those persons whose dues are currently paid. Membership begins at the date of payment and extends through September 30 of the period paid (one to three years). A grace period of sixty days is allowed for renewal of membership. Members shall receive notification of impending membership expiration.

The proposed change is:

Membership shall be limited to those persons whose dues are currently paid. Membership begins at the month of payment and extends for the term of membership (one year to three years). A grace period of sixty days is allowed for renewal of membership. Members shall receive notification of impending membership expiration.

In effect, we are reverting back to the wording of Article I that was changed in 2004. According to the fall 2004 issue of the *NEMA News*, the rationale for the 2004 change was that "A uniform membership expiration date close to the annual conference will assist members in remembering when to pay their dues and be helpful to the executive secretary in communicating with members about renewals" because renewal notices could be sent out once a year, instead of twelve times.

The rationale now is that by having monthly renewal dates we encourage people to join at any time rather than waiting until fall. This came to our attention at the Heartland Conference, held in Omaha in June. NEMA had a table with membership application forms and prospective members were concerned that if they joined in June, they would need to renew October 1. Technology has improved so that sending out monthly reminders shouldn't be as cumbersome as it was in 2004.

A vote of the membership will take place at Conference during the annual meeting.

July Board Meeting Highlights

The NEMA board met on Thursday, July 15 at Scott Middle School in Lincoln. The new Board officially took office and President Betty Meyer called the meeting to order. We discussed many topics for the upcoming year. The conference is a big focus for fall and is going to be exciting. Mary Reiman reported on some wonderful progress made with an ad hoc committee focusing on Rule 24. Partnership and support of the NLC continues to be a rewarding experience as the commission received a new grant called "Cultivating Rural Librarians' Technology Skills". AASL Affiliate Assembly met during ALA and discussed such topics as filters, data reporting tools, and librarians being viewed as teachers. There will be a new L4L planning guide available online for a subscription fee. NEMA now has a Twitter account and a Facebook page. You can follow us at **21cnesl** or fan us at **21st Century Nebraska School Librarians**. Plus, look for a surprise unveiling at the conference in October. The strategic plan and master calendar have been set for the year. Finally, we are also looking to trademark our School Libraries Rock phrase and set up Paypal to accept memberships online. The next board meeting will be September 18 at 10 a.m. in Kearney.

National Library Legislative Day

On June 29 over 1,600 library advocates met in Washington D.C. The national Library Legislative Day normally occurs in May, but with the ALA national conference taking place in DC this year, it was moved to coincide with the attendance of thousands of librarians and library supporters. ALA prints red t-shirts for the occasion, handing them out to participants. The result was a sea of red as the attendees met on the National Mall by the Capital building!

Several speakers talked to the crowd about the importance of libraries and librarians, including author Lauren Myracle (*ttyl, ttfh*). Senators Jack Reed (D-RI) and Vernon Ehlers (R-MI) also spoke. Sen. Reed discussed ESEA and the need to include school libraries in it, referring to them as “the heart and soul” of education.

The state of Nebraska was well represented by public, special, academic, and school librarians. As we visited our state’s elected representatives and senators, our charge for schools was to discuss the need for school libraries and librarians to be included in the ESEA bill. We were very fortunate to meet with four of our five elected officials, Representatives Lee Terry, Jeff Fortenberry and Adrian Smith as well as Senator Mike Johanns. We met with Senator Ben Nelson’s aides.



In Nebraska, we are not feeling the deep cuts that other states are experiencing in school libraries. The time we spent with our national representatives was important in moving forward the plight of school libraries, their importance in education and in turn, their inclusion in ESEA.

I was proud to represent NEMA in a professional capacity and to belong to an organization that is willing to place their leadership at the forefront of library advocacy.

Nebraska Department of Education News

An ad hoc committee of representatives from Nebraska school libraries, universities, school and NDE administrators met on June 21 to begin study of the current Rule 24 Library Media and Information Technology Endorsement Guidelines. The current library media specialist guidelines were analyzed. Our title has been changed to school librarian. The Rule 24 Guidelines are becoming more inclusive of PreK-12 education and will be re-written to align with the ALA/AASL National Standards as well as the NCATE (National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education) Standards. The Nebraska Council on Teacher Education (NCTE) will review the endorsements, with final approval in March by the State Board of Education. The revised guidelines will then go to the Attorney General and Governor to be signed. The anticipated date for this to go into effect is August 2012.

Getting the bound copy of a NEMA publication from a national publishing company will be impressive to administrators and the Commissioner's endorsement will add even more credibility.

At the October 2010 NLA/NEMA conference NEMA will make available to members the seventh edition of *The Guide for Developing and Evaluating School Library Programs* (more familiarly known as the *Nebraska Guide*). The guide will be published by Libraries Unlimited for sale and distribution to all non-NEMA members but, according to the agreement outlined in the LU contract, **all NEMA members will get a NEMA printed copy of the guide.**

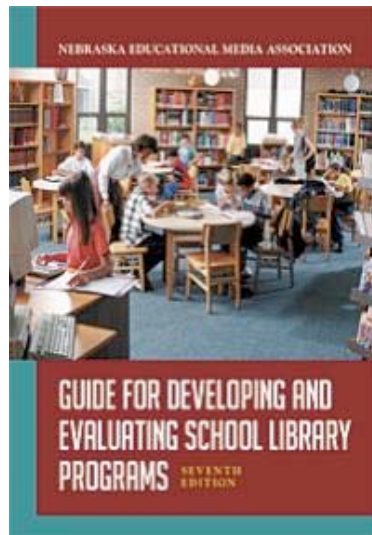

AASL Affiliate Assembly at ALA Convention

NEMA was represented at the AASL Affiliate Assembly (AA) during the ALA National Conference in Washington, D.C., in June. During the two sessions of AA, representatives from across the U.S. voted on concerns and commendations submitted by the affiliates. The approved concerns and commendations will be submitted to the AASL Executive Board for further action. Some of the concerns presented by affiliates included how to effectively deal with barriers to information and 21st century tools that are filtered, blocked by firewalls, and limited by bandwidth; the need for data reporting tools for school librarians to report on student success; and the need for school librarians to be recognized as teachers so they can apply for the Stafford Loan Forgiveness Program for Teachers. Selected commendations will be announced at the Midwinter Conference in January.

There were many discussions about the reduction and/or elimination of school librarians' positions and programs around the country. It was a reality for many of the affiliates in attendance.

The new Learning 4 Life (L4L) Planning Guide with School Library Program Rubric, which will aid school librarians in assessing their school library programs, should be available in August. The guide includes a rubric that allows school librarians to assess their program on 16 different sets of criteria and print reports. The subscription cost is \$40 for the first year, and \$20 for subsequent years. District subscriptions will also be available and a free online, interactive planning and advocacy tool will also be available soon. (<http://www.ala.org/aasl/planningguide>)

Nancy Everhart, incoming AASL President, plans to visit 35 "exemplary" school libraries during her year in office. 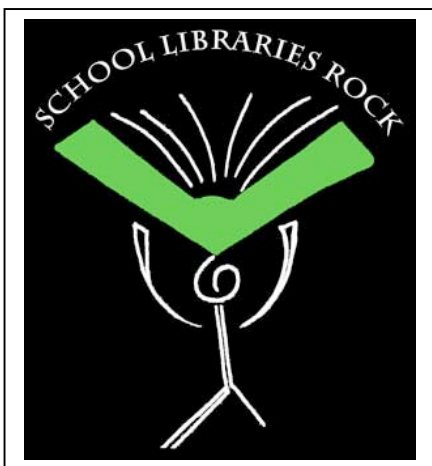
